LEPC Exercise 2010

Proposed Date: Tuesday August 3, 2010

Proposed Time: 0930 to 1200 hours

Scene will be cleared by 1100 hours

Hospital will receive their last patients by 1130 hours

Proposed location: MS Gulf Coast Community College, Gautier MS.

Note: college will provide one bus

Proposed scenario: A bus has blown up with a large number of victims, unknown reason. Law enforcement will note that this was a terrorist bomb and unsure of materials--- decon situation

Exercise will start at 0925 with three calls to 911 that there has been an explosion at the college with victims, No buildings were impacted

Number of proposed victims: 85

Breakdown per hospital:

SRH: 10 with decon

OSH 10 with decon

BRMC: 15 with decon

VA: 10

GPMC: 15 with decon

GM: 20

HMC ? 5

Patients that need to be simulated moved to Kessler will be 25. Note: Jackson County hospitals will perform this function.

Note: because of time and expense victims for all but the Jackson County participants will drive to the hospital assigned them and be staged from there. All Jackson County victims will be on the bomb site scene. All victims will be simulated from coming from the scene and timed to arrive at other hospitals based on distance

Victims will include walking wounded and serious injuries with possibility some burns.

Moulage will be provided by Kessler personnel --- location or locations will be determine at a later date

Gautier police will secure the scene and provide traffic control

Fire department will provide resources if possible

Problems noted for the exercise at this time: Working on roads in Gautier---traffic flow, BP\oil spill is utilizing a lot of resources which will be unavailable for the drill.
